A great deal was accomplished at the Board of Education's first meeting of the month. Among their most important actions was the introduction of this month's...

<u>Student Spotlight</u>: This is kindergartner **Alivia Long**. Principal **Rachael Johnson** told those in attendance Alivia was selected for the positive energy she exudes with her classmates and teachers. She said, "One time, I witnessed Alivia help a student follow the group plan in a classroom. She saw

that her peer was struggling and, without even being asked, went to the student and offered for them to join her. The student immediately responded positively to her invitation and was able to successfully participate in the activity." <u>School Showcase</u>: Principal Johnson was joined by our 4K Coordinator, **Ms. Nicole Tepe**, to present to the Board the progress being made in their school and programmatic goals. We continue to be impressed with the social, emotional, and academic goals established for our youngest Vikings; moreover, we continue to be grateful for the strong foundation our children receive from our 4K partner sites.

<u>Memorandum of Understanding with Mount Horeb Police Department</u>: School safety continues to be a major consideration in educating our children. This responsibility calls for even stronger partnerships with those sworn to "serve and protect". Expansion of communication between the District and the Mount Horeb Police Department was part of last night's Board agenda. The administrative team has proposed entering in to a MOU between both entities for the purposes of identifying what information is shared. Increasingly, community related issues are finding their way into the schools with less than favorable results. How would an MOU help? Confidential, open communication will permit school leaders and staff the opportunity to triple their efforts in monitoring simmering community issues so they do not boil over in our schools (vice versa).

<u>Referendum Update</u>: Coordinator of Building Services, Mr. **Dave Reed**, was on hand to update the Board on the progress made in our High School's expansion. Using multiple pictures to paint the picture (<u>take a look at these</u>), he reminded the Board our entire project continues to be "on-time" and "under budget".
