Proposed Charter School – The Board and administration enjoyed listening to community members' feedback about the Driftless Area Community School (DACS). Since the spring, DACS design team members have been discussing the possibility of the District hosting their proposed charter at the Intermediate Center. A working draft of the charter, proposed by DACS, may be found <u>here</u>. Next steps: DACS has asked the Board to consider writing a letter of intent to partner DACS. DACS would like this letter by the end of November so DACS can determine the pathway they need to follow in applying for a federal grant. Any decision about an intent letter could come at the Board's November 18, 2019. The Board has received feedback from all perspectives on this topic.
